### FUNDACION EDUCATIVA AMOR (Colombia)

Fundacion Educativa Amor is a school & community center for a migrant community on the outskirts of Bogota. MSF support helps to provide primary and secondary education and a range of community support services for students and their families.

## **ASOCIACION VIVIR (Ecuador)**

MSF funding assisted Asociacion Vivir in promoting, through a human and proactive approach, good health to disadvantaged individuals & communities. Based in Quito Ecuador, it is run by Dr. Eliana Garzon and is now active throughout the country offering workshops on a wide range of health topics, promoting self-care and health to local people and educational training courses in traditional alternative and indigenous medicine. MSF's grant helped Asociacion Vivir to complete its publicity materials.

## **INTERNATIONAL CHILD DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM (ICDP)**

MSF funding helps ICDP to promote long-term assistance for children by sensitizing caregivers to their children's needs. This project has been well funded in some countries through the university networks and governments. MSF's grant enabled ICDP to produce an ICDP Policy and Procedures Document, which will enable ICDP to present a better profile to its donors and future sponsors.

## **YAYASAN USAHA MULIA (Indonesia)**

In 1998, MSF's grant help provide nutritious food, accommodation, and education for disadvantaged children, and the construction of a small building for training purposes. In 2007-8 MSF provided educational sponsorships for children in Indonesia through Yayasan Usaha Mulia [<http://www.yumindonesia.org>]:

25 sponsorships in West Java near the Children's Village; 35 in Central Kalimantan; and 4 university scholarships. Funding for this program is made possible from proceeds emanating from the Farkas Endowment Fund.

## **NKEMBO SCHOOL (Moanda, D.R. Congo)**

In 1988, Kiti Ki and Marie Claire began this school which has now, with the assistance of MSF, grown to include the education of 650 children, micro-enterprises and local teacher training. In Spokane 1997, a partnership was created between Nkembo School and several Susila Dharma ("SD") national organizations, headed up by Lienhard Berger of SD Switzerland. In 1999 the school was visited by six people from Europe, South Africa and USA. Kiti Ki and Marie Claire Menghi have proven themselves to be able to develop and operate an impressive school that serves the surrounding community. Good financial management has been put in place with the help of SD France. MSF's grant was made possible by the Farkas Fund for the development of a long term building plan for the Nkembo School.

## **DISSÉA CLINIC (Boma, Bas Congo)**

With the help of MSF, "Polyclinique Dispensaire des Soins de Sante et d'Entraide Sociale" (DISSÉA) opened in 1993 and is run by a trained doctor and a support team of 8 (1997). This clinic is also the Subud center in Boma. Boma is downriver from Muanda, where the Nkembo School is located. The long term plan is that these two projects will eventually work together in an international partnership. Initiated by Dr.Nsingi-zi-Mbala, the project is legally registered and is affiliated with the NGO network in the area.

## **NKANDU CLINIC (Inkisi, D.R. Congo)**

Dr. Luwawu, a retired doctor and former hospital manager, cares for this clinic with the aim to create a Maternity Center and a center for nutritional education. As a Subud member he has served as the chair of Susila Dharma and also as the national SES representative. In addition to his medical work at the hospital, he began a modest clinic for poor people in Nkandu, a village of 7000 people, in 1987. From Simone van Beek - "There is ... a letter of thanks written to Dr. Luwawu by the Health Dept. of the city of Nkandu/Inkisi which describes the importance of his work in his private clinic which so often helps the poorest women with their births and pediatric follow-up for free. And he is particularly thanked for his help during the time when the soldiers were there. They wish him success in expanding his clinic since his center is indispensable and helpful as well to the recycling and experience of medical personnel."

## **EARTHQUAKE RELIEF (Colombia)**

In response to the 1999 earthquake in Colombia, MSF donated \$5,000 to Amanecer via Susila Dharma International for aid relief. The Amanecer Foundation was able to provide a residence and psycho-social assistance to 110 children and their mothers for 18 months. This program was recognized by the Province as one of "Quindío's Worthy Neighbours."

## **INDONESIA RELIEF AND DEVELOPMENT NETWORK (Indonesia)**

With assistance from MSF, IRDN was able to lessen the impact of the 1997/8 Asian Economic Crisis on impoverished Subud members and other families living near Subud groups and Susila Dharma projects. IRDN purchased basic commodities - rice, sugar, cooking oil, milk - and sold them to needy families at 50% below market prices. IRDN also provided educational support by subsidizing school fees and books. MSF donated \$6000 to help get this project started. IRDN later merged with Yayasan Usaha Mulia (YUM).

1999-2002 grants: US\$ 17,000



## **SEKOLAH BINA CITA UTAMA (Indonesia)**

Launched in July 2005, BCU is the first 'National Plus' school to be registered with the Department of National Education in Central Kalimantan. MSF initially assisted BCU by providing travel funding in 2005-6 for Subud youth volunteers.

In 2009, MSF's grant enabled the construction of two additional classrooms to accommodate the increasing number of students.

## **LEWES NEW SCHOOL (UK)**

Opened in September 2000, Lewes New School provides holistic education for 5-11 year olds, plus a nursery and after school club. MSF's grant helped to cover the costs and the interest of a commercial loan for a two year period, enabling the purchase of the school building to be finalised.

## Mutual Savings & Loans Co-op microcredit

The Mutual Savings and Loans Co-op (Mutuelle d'Épargne et de Crédit), MEC, has been operating since April 2009. MEC's main activity is to collect and secure its members' savings and give them access to low-interest loans. This rural local bank was created by the people and for the people. The Foundation grant enabled the cooperative to launch two services: savings accounts, and loans with an interest rate of 6 percent. It already has 755 members, and 675 are participating in the mutual savings fund.

2009 loan: US\$ 4,000



## Yayasan Tambuhak Sinta (Indonesia)

Established in 1997, YTS works to improve the quality of life for the people of Kalimantan through health, education, livelihood and governance programs. In 2009, MSF provided a grant of US\$20,000 to launch this project, undertaken in response to a request from Yayasan Usaha Mulia (YUM) for support to strengthen the links between the six communities where YUM is working in the Bukit Batu Sub-district and local government at the sub-district and district levels.
