MSF COLOMBIA

MSF COLOMBIA was formed in 1994 as a legally-registered charitable foundation in Colombia to hold assets on behalf of the Foundation through a branch relationship. The Foundation appointed MSF Colombia as its legal representative in Colombia through a 1994 agreement which was updated in 2003, and is currently in the process of renewal once again. MSF Colombia holds the title to the Muhammad Subuh Hall at Amanecer, a meeting venue situated in a rural setting on a hill with a view of the mountains and snow-capped peaks of the Central Andes mountain range. The Hall was constructed during 1991-1993 with a US\$250,000 grant made by the Muhammad Subuh Foundation. Large numbers of people can be accommodated, and it served as the site of the 1993 Subud World Congress. Designed by Muchtar Martins, a Portuguese architect, the Hall is locally renowned for its beauty and creative design.

The Hall is managed by Fundacion Amanecer, a charitable foundation legally registered in Colombia in 1990, through a lease agreement with MSF Colombia. The directors of Fundacion Amanecer are appointed by the national committee of Subud Colombia. In 2008, the Foundation provided a grant to Fundacion Amanecer of US\$11,000 and in 2009 a further grant of US\$8,000 for the purpose of general repairs to the facilities and management capacity-building.

YAYASAN MUHAMMAD SUBUH

YAYASAN MUHAMMAD SUBUH (“YMS”) is one of the related organizations of the Muhammad Subuh Foundation. YMS was legally registered in 1989 as a charitable foundation based in Jakarta.

In 1997 YMS entered into a Memorandum of Understanding with the Muhammad Subuh Foundation, forming the beginning of its formal relationship with the Foundation. World Subud Association assets held by YMS through its organizational relationship with MSF are the “Big House” (Bapak’s former residence, recently renamed “Adi Puri”) and the “Archive house” in Wisma Subud, Jakarta. In 2008, MSF provided YMS with a loan of US\$50,000 and a grant of US\$19,616 for the renovation of Adi Puri. In 2009, US\$10,000 of the loan was converted into a grant.

YMS’s wholly-owned assets include the Muhammad Subuh Centre and Eco Village in Central Kalimantan. The Muhammad Subuh Centre in Central Kalimantan is a meeting venue set atop a hill overlooking Rungan Sari residential compound and Eco Village. The Eco Village serves as rental accommodation for guests who wish to experience a natural rustic setting bordering the jungle.

YMS also oversees the care and maintenance of the Subud archives in Indonesia, and operates a wholly-owned business, PT Pancaran Cahaya Bahagia (PT PCB). PT PCB’s responsibilities include managing the Muhammad Subuh Centre, the Kedung Jati Cafe, a guest house in Sei Gohong, and Eco Village in Rungan Sari, Central Kalimantan. PT PCB also owns 149 hectares (ha) in the area: 137 ha at Rungan Sari, 2 ha in Tangkiling, and 10 ha in Marang.

YAYASAN SUBUD

YAYASAN SUBUD was legally established as a charitable foundation in Indonesia in March 1976, and was previously known as “Jajasan Dana Subud” (established February 1959). Its purpose is to hold and manage assets in a residential compound known as “Wisma Subud”, South Jakarta. The assets include the main hall, guest house, and additional land within the compound.

Wisma Subud was established in 1960, when Bapak purchased several hectares of land in the South Jakarta suburb of Cilandak. At that time, the area was filled with paddy fields and small farms. From these humble beginnings, Bapak created Subud’s first “international centre”.

In 2006, Yayasan Subud became a related organization of the Muhammad Subuh Foundation through the appointment of a trustee of MSF as one of the Patrons of Yayasan Subud. Day-to-day work of Yayasan Subud continues to be carried out by its own board of management. Currently, one trustee of MSF lives in Indonesia and is able to meet regularly with Yayasan Subud to ensure effective communication.

A Memorandum of Understanding between Yayasan Subud and the Muhammad Subuh Foundation was signed in 2011 to further strengthen the ties between the two organizations.
